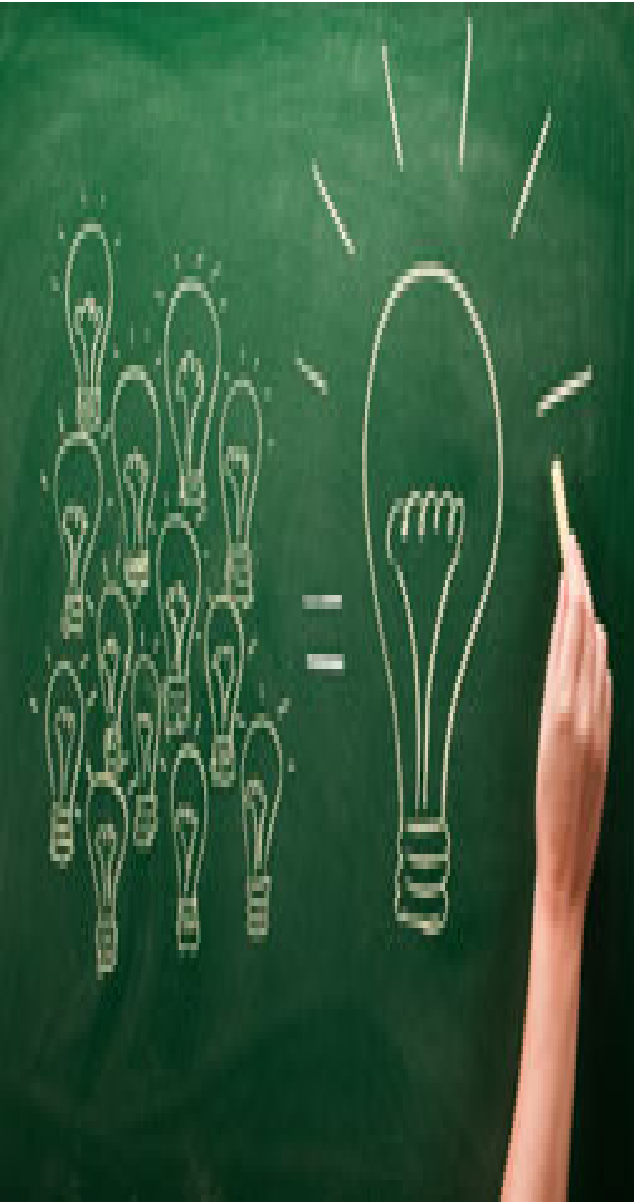

Principles of successful innovations

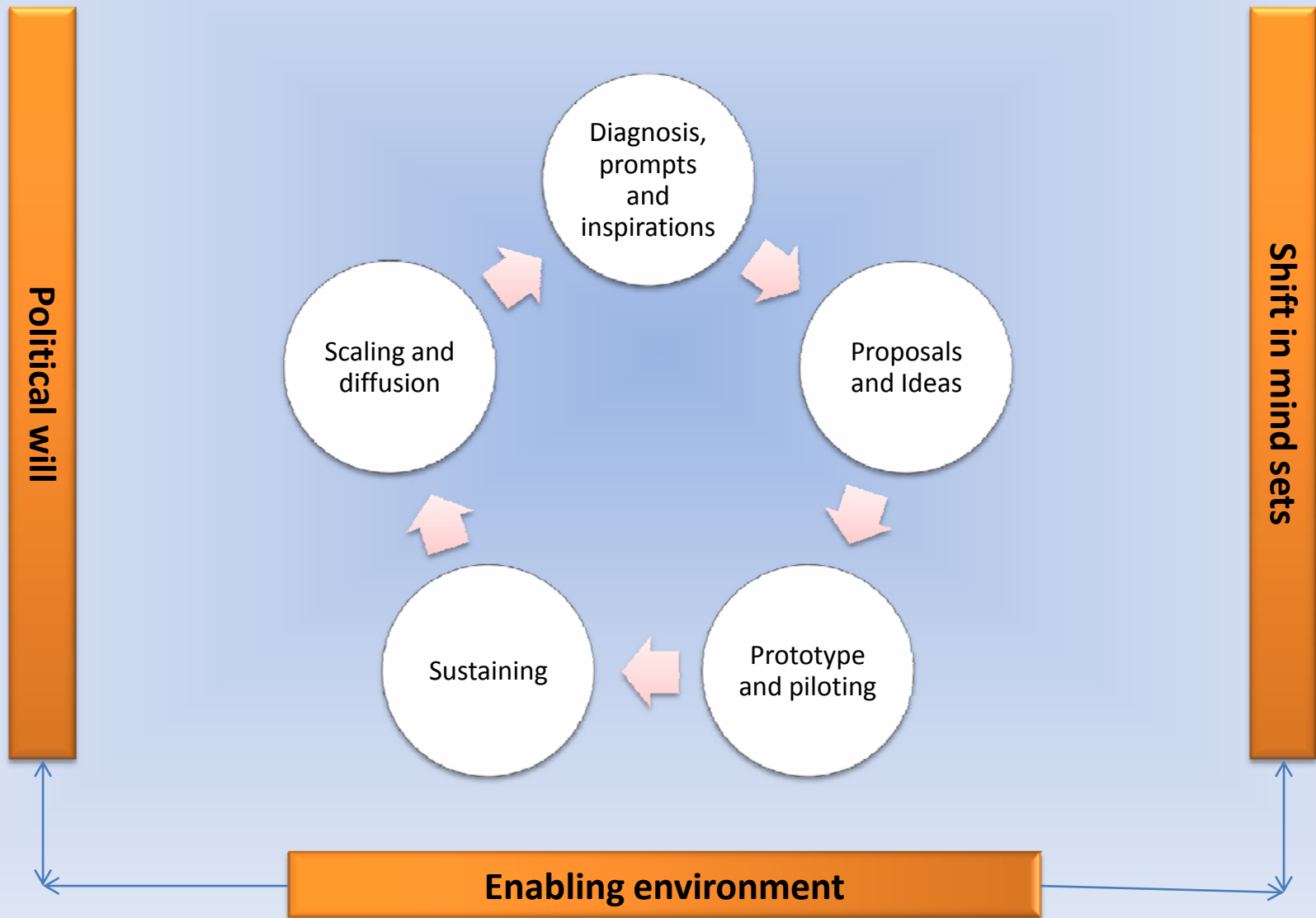


- Centrality of Ownership

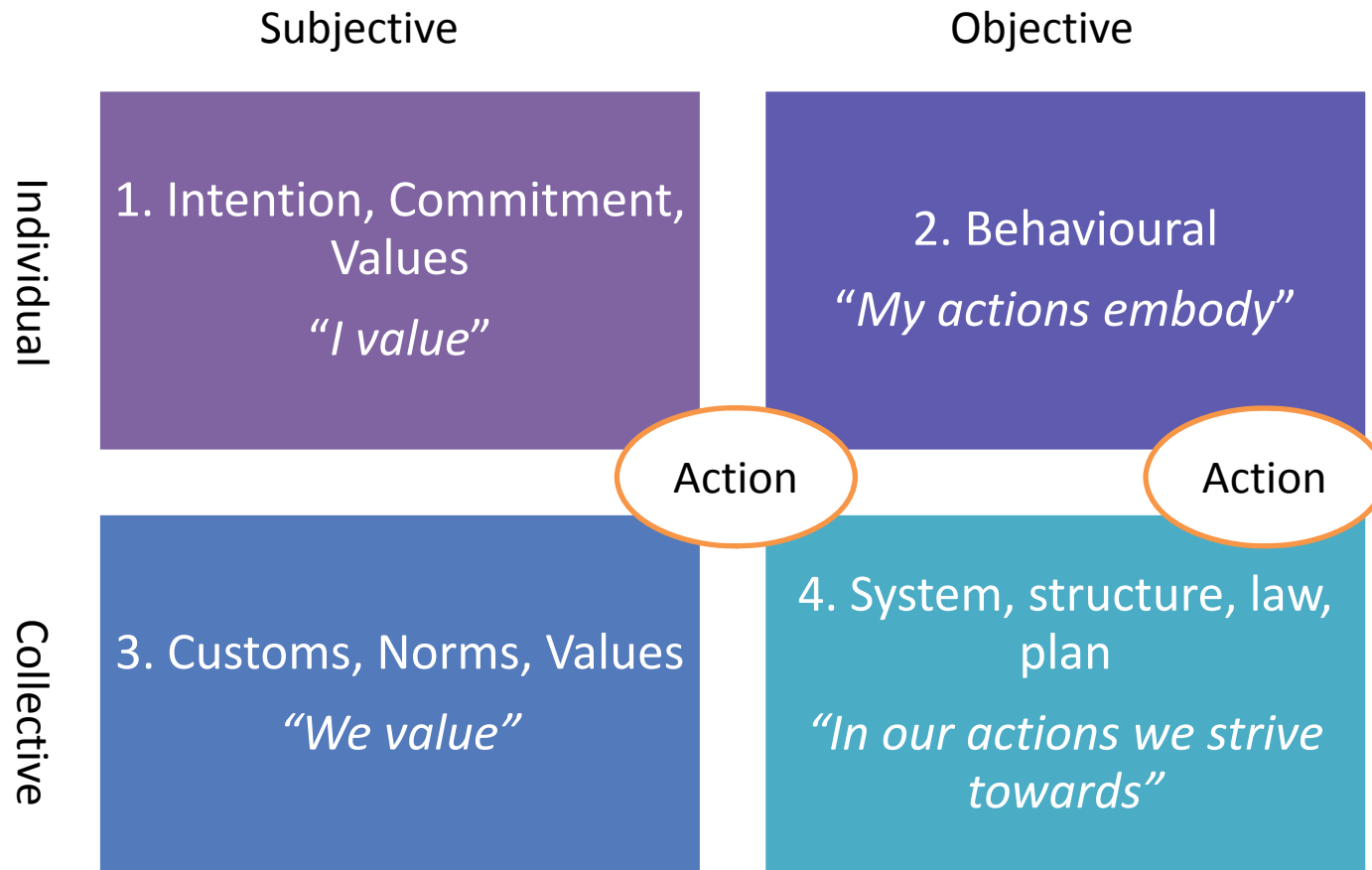
Building Innovation for Systemic Change
